For Easter Break 2009

MACS Discovery Days offers a variety of activities for **Kindergarten through fifth graders** during the school year for most days when school is not in session. This registration form and your tuition must be dropped off at the MACS Education Office or received by mail by the indicated date below. DO NOT turn in registrations to your school office or to the after school program. Registrations received at the MACS Office after the indicated registration deadline will automatically be placed on a waiting list and will be accepted ONLY IF staff : child ratios allow. Late registrations will be notified promptly by phone for space availability. Because supplies, activities, and staffing are dependent upon registration numbers, we do not accept drop-ins. Your child will receive a Discovery Day T-shirt on his/her first Discovery Day. Additional T-shirts may be purchased for \$10. Please pack a bagged lunch, (2) snacks and drinks for your child. Please dress your child in comfortable play clothes and sneakers (no sandals, flip flops, etc.). Discovery Day registration forms will be found in the Thursday packets and on-line at www.charlottediocese.org/programs. Registration will take place one month prior to each month's Discovery Days.

Mon., April 13, 2009: SC State House, Columbia, SC

We will have a private tour of the Grand House of the Palmetto State where we will learn about the history, architecture and finer details of the house. We will also view an art exhibit especially for children and everyone will receive a souvenir from the gift shop.

Tues., April 14, 2009: Tiger World, Rockwell, NC

Tiger World is a non-profit animal conservation and education center. We will have a private, guided tour through the facility where we will learn about lions, tigers, and bears up close.

Wed., April 15, 2009: Patterson Farm, Mount Ulla, NC

We are going on a Pizza Tour! Patterson Farm is a 3rd generation working farm that grows seasonal fruits and vegetables. In addition to learning about the important role farming plays in today's world, children will learn about farm animals and participate in hands-on farming activities.

Thurs., April 16, 2009: Pineville Ice House

Join us for a fun day on the ice at the Pineville Ice House. No ice skating experience necessary, just bring a smile, warm clothes, and a good attitude and we'll provide the rest!

Fri., April 17, 2009: Fort Dobbs, Statesville, NC

Fort Dobbs was a military post during the French Indian War. We will travel back in time to the year 1759 where we will learn about the lives and events of NC settlers, Indians and soldiers during the Great War for Empire between England and France. Hands-on activity stations include: cooking, musket ball making, music, quill writing, medicine, colonial games and much more. We traveled to Fort Dobbs last year and found this event to be very educational and a lot of fun.
